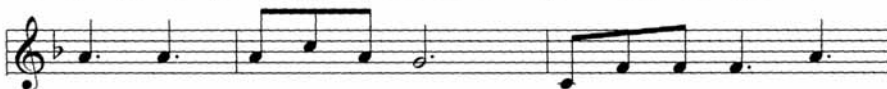

Share the Gifts

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant. The bread is received in the open palm. The wine may be taken from the common cup, **or if you wish to dip bread in the wine, extend one hand for a wafer.** Both wine and unfermented grape juice are served, grape juice is administered from the pottery chalice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request in the East alcove.



Prayer and Laying-on of Hands for Healing

We invite those wishing particular prayer for themselves or on behalf of someone else, or to share in a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings received, to come to the front of the line to receive the bread and wine. Immediately after receiving, go to the prayer station. Give your first name and in a low voice briefly state your prayer need. The prayer team will lay hands gently on your shoulders and after a short silence, they will pray quietly for you.

While the communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence — this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.

Choosing to list your name on the Parish Roll means that you get a vote at our Annual Vestry, which determines the budget and direction of the Cathedral each year. It's also the best way for you to ensure that the Cathedral knows how to contact

you (including sending you donation tax receipts and annual reports). Finally, it's an affirming sign to this community that you like it so much that you wish to formally join the parish!

Who does What at the Cathedral?

Mark can also answer your questions about monetary gifts to the Cathedral, and if you are interested in volunteering for one of our many ministries here at Christ Church Cathedral. If you are a newcomer, Mark can help introduce you to folks with similar interests at Christ Church.

Contact Kathy Irwin if: you have questions about how a donation was processed, or will be processed, or if you have any questions about the Cathedral's budgeting and accounting. Also contact Kathy if your ministry group is interested in planning an event that involves raising or spending money.

Contact Gord MacDonald if: you would like to book a room at the Cathedral for a Cathedral-related event. Please note, the Cathedral cannot guarantee space as this is a very popular place for meetings and gatherings. Non-cathedral related events will be asked to make a building use donation, and what makes an event a "cathedral" or "non-cathedral" event is at the discretion of the Dean. Often

your clergy contact person will be able to assist you with this. Gord also take care of all facilities related concerns (audio equipment, unlocking doors, etc).

Contact Vincent Carey if: you are scheduled for a voluntary shift at Christ Church and you have been unable to connect with your Ministry Leader with regard to confirming or changing a scheduled shift. Also contact Vincent with updates to your contact information or status here at Christ Church.

Contact Rupert Lang if: you would like to audition for the Cathedral Choir.

Notes from the Deacon & Business Chaplain

AUGUST 15, 2010

Aloha! I write from "Chinaman's Hat", a beach park on the east side of O'ahu. This is a favorite spot of mine, the warm ocean breeze blows across a shallow reef, and just to my right, as I look out, is the tiny island shaped like a, well, er, like well, you get my drift!

I'll be at CCC on Sunday, I'll be the one wistfully dreaming of tropical breezes! Although I do look forward to our new curate's sermon and to the presence of Lois Boxill as our presider. And if you're new to our community or just visiting, may I, on behalf of all of us, welcome you here this morning. I think you're in for a treat!

As I reflect on this morning's Gospel, I am once again reminded of how the idea of God as Love, turns the world upside down. Listen to the words of Mary this morning as she describes a world where the mighty are brought down and the hungry are fed a banquet.

As much as this is a real encounter with the very present Divine, it is at the same time a dream of a possible and still to emerge future state. In Luke's gospel we are reminded, time and again of both "now" and "not yet." The breaking in of the Kingdom of God has begun and is still to become. What does this look like then for us in our time?

One of my sad regrets is not being able to share time here in Hawaii with my dear friend Mairi. Mairi died of breast cancer in the late summer of 2004. About this time that year, I was visiting her and we believed at the time that she would be alive to come to Hawaii with us the next spring. She did not live long enough to do that. She died at 45 years of age.

My Mairi did experience many wonderful things in her life; love, much laughter and an emerging environment that was that much more inclusive for Gay and Lesbian people, with each passing year. And, to have died so young, she missed so much,

including sitting here, looking out at this idyllic island scene. Perhaps though more importantly, she did not live long enough to fulfill her dream of a world where all people, regardless of their sexual orientation, the colour of their skin, their gender, or their economic status would be able to live, love and appear in public without shame.

Mairi's legacy to me, and Mary's legacy to all of us, is; good work, and there is much more to do! At some level that is what Luke's Gospel means, it's here now, and it's not yet here, the Peace of Christ needs all of us to keep loving, keep forgiving, keep standing up to indifference and violence. To turn this too often dangerous and unforgiving society upside down. We may not live to see the day where the sky is this blue, the breeze this warm for all people, but each succeeding generation needs to be able to build on our work right now.

In the hope of that, I bid you Aloha and Shalom!
