*Presenters* **I present Nicholas Beckett Rysz Dixon, Marshall Peter Mallinder, to receive  
the sacrament of baptism.**

*Presider* Will you be responsible for seeing that the child you present  
is nurtured in the faith and life of the Christian community?  
*Presenters* **I will, with God's help.**

*Presider* Will you by your prayers and witness help this child to grow  
into the full stature of Christ?  
*Presenters* **I will, with God's help.**

*Then the presider asks the following questions of the candidates and presenters:*

*Presider* Do you renounce Satan and all the spiritual forces of wickedness  
that rebel against God?

*Answer* **I renounce them.**

*Presider* Do you renounce the evil powers of this world which corrupt and destroy the  
creatures of God?

*Answer* **I renounce them.**

*Presider* Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

*Answer* **I renounce them.**

*Presider* Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?  
*Answer* I do.

*Presider* Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?  
*Answer* I do.

*Presider* Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?  
*Answer* I do.

*When the candidates have been presented and the renunciations and affirmations have been made, the presider will ask:*

*Presider* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

*All* We will.

*The congregation remains standing for Prayers for the Candidates; to the petition "Lord, in your mercy" please respond "Hear our prayer." Following the concluding collect, the liturgy continues with the Thanksgiving over the Water:*

*The presider blesses the water:*

*Presider* The Lord be with you  
*All* And also with you.

*Presider* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
*All* It is right to give our thanks and praise.

*Presider* We give you thanks, almighty God, for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

*Presider* We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.  
*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.  
*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with his gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood.  
*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks for you have called **Lavinia, Nicholas and Marshall** to new life through the waters of baptism.

Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit and bring them to new

birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom.

We praise you, merciful Father, not as we ought, but as we are able, because in your tender love you gave the world your only Son, in order that the world might be saved through him. He made you known by taking the form of a servant, healing the sick, liberating the oppressed, reaching out to the lost. Betrayed, reviled, and nailed to the cross, he confronted the power of sin and disarmed it for ever. 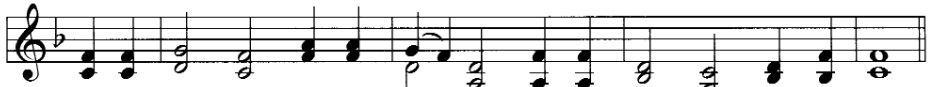

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### *Share the Gifts*

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant. The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. **If you wish to dip bread in the wine, extend one hand for a wafer.** Both wine and unfermented grape juice are served, grape juice is administered from the pottery chalice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request in the East alcove.



### *Prayer and Laying-on of Hands for Healing*

We invite those wishing particular prayer for themselves or on behalf of someone else, or to share in a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings received, to come to the front of the line to receive the bread and wine. Immediately after receiving, go to the prayer station. Give your first name and in a low voice briefly state your prayer need. The prayer team will lay hands gently on your shoulders and after a short silence, they will pray quietly for you.

*While the communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence — this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.*

### *MusicFest Vancouver Fills the Cathedral with Music This August*

The Cathedral will be filled with spectacular classical, jazz and world music again this August, as MusicFest Vancouver returns with its tenth anniversary season from August 6 - 15, 2010. Hundreds of artists are coming to the festival from almost a dozen different countries, and there's a special 2010 festival-wide spotlight on Australia.

The concerts scheduled for the Cathedral will feature some remarkable artists. France's brilliant Renaissance vocal ensemble Ludus Modalis performs on August 6 and 9, acclaimed Canadian soprano Yannick-Muriel Noah appears in a recital on August 12, favourite Vancouver chamber ensemble the Borealis String Quartet performs on August 13, and the effervescent Australian a cappella quartet The Idea of North offers a program of jazz standards on August 14.

Also at the Cathedral, the free educational series Inside the Music returns with a half-dozen entertaining and informative afternoon presentations. Subjects range from a top pianist's insights on understanding Chopin's piano music, to the inside story on that quintessential Australian instrument,

the didgeridoo!

# Dean's Notes

AUGUST 8TH, 2010

## *Making Sacred*

“And what is sacrifice? To sacrifice is literally to ‘make a thing sacred’; it is to take something out of common use and make it over to God. It is a symbolic act by which we recognize that everything in this world derives from another order of being and seeks to enter into communion with that other world. But the outward thing which is sacrificed can never be more than a sign of an inward offering; what we desire is to offer ourselves. The essential sacrifice has to take place in the center of our own being, in the darkness of the interior where alone we can encounter the God who is hidden in the depths of the soul. We have to pass beyond all the images of the senses, beyond all the concepts of the mind, beyond ourselves if we are really to find God.”

(Bede Griffiths O.S.B., *The Golden String* 1954)

At the heart of Christian worship is this notion of sacrifice—things from common use given to God. This is the meaning of the Holy Eucharist—common things—bread and wine, offered to God become the spiritual food of the body and blood of Christ. Water—another common thing, when offered to God conveys the story of God’s people throughout the generations—water of creation, water of the Red Sea, water of the Jordan River—and in the sacrament of baptism, as each person is brought to this water, their lives are made one with the people of God.

Making a thing sacred—transformation of common into holy things—as Bede Griffith says ‘what we desire is to offer ourselves.’ This is beautifully expressed in the Anglican Book of Common Prayer where, in the prayer after Communion, we pray, “And here we offer and present unto thee, O Lord, ourselves, our souls and bodies, to be a reasonable, holy and living sacrifice unto thee.” (BCP p. 85). Living sacrifices through our very selves—why? So that through us, through the baptized, God’s mission of justice, peace, human dignity and care of the earth can be furthered.

One of the notions that creeps around Christian life

is this thought that “God has a plan for my life” and behind that notion seems to be the thought that there is, somewhere in eternity, a blueprint for each individual life—and the goal of life is to discover that plan and put it into practice. In my view this is not Christianity—it is a notion that grows out of a culture obsessed with individualism. What I think is true is that each one of us is gifted with particular skills and abilities and as we offer our lives to God our gifts and skills become directed not toward our own comfort and security but the healing of the world. I’ve seen people’s lives transformed from being obsessed with their own success to becoming focused on how their lives can be of service in the world. And when I see this happen, I believe that there has been the transformation of a life that the sacraments of the church can facilitate.

For if we really pay attention at Eucharist and Baptism we see this all acted out—the things of common use become instruments of God’s grace. So can we. May it be so!

\* \* \* \* \*

It’s with mixed feelings that we say farewell to the Reverend Patrick Blaney this morning. Patrick’s ministry at the Cathedral since August 2008 has been characterized by deep commitment, good humour, great intelligence, wonderful articulation, and generous sharing of his gifts. St. Thomas’s Vancouver is fortunate and will be blessed to have Patrick as their clergy leader. Every blessing Patrick—we send you forth with God’s blessings!
