*Presider* Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

*Answer* I do.

*When the candidate has been presented and the renunciations and affirmations have been made, the presider will ask:*

*Presider* Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support this person in their life in Christ?

*All* We will.

*The congregation remains standing for Prayers for the Candidate; to the petition "Lord, in your mercy" please respond "Hear our prayer." Following the concluding collect, the liturgy continues with the Thanksgiving over the Water:*

*The presider blesses the water:*

*Presider* The Lord be with you

*All* And also with you.

*Presider* Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

*All* It is right to give our thanks and praise.

*Presider* We give you thanks, almighty God, for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea, you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.

*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus. For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit. For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection, setting us free from the bondage of sin and death, and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.

*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth, filling us with his gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations and serve you as a royal priesthood.

*All* Blessed be God for ever.

*Presider* We give you thanks for you have called Rajan to new life through the waters of baptism.

Now sanctify this water, that your servant who is washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection, to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint him with your Holy Spirit and bring him to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become an inheritor of your glorious kingdom.

We give you praise and honour and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit  
you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin,

and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen.

*One of the ministers then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:*

that they may see your good works  
and glorify your Father in heaven.

### *Share the Gifts*

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant. The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. **If you wish to dip bread in the wine, extend one hand for a wafer.** Both wine and unfermented grape juice are served, grape juice is administered from the pottery chalice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request in the East alcove.



### *Prayer and Laying-on of Hands for Healing*

We invite those wishing particular prayer for themselves or on behalf of someone else, or to share in a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings received, to come to the front of the line to receive the bread and wine. Immediately after receiving, go to the prayer station. Give your first name and in a low voice briefly state your prayer need. The prayer team will lay hands gently on your shoulders and after a short silence, they will pray quietly for you.

*While the communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence — this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.*

## *Education for Ministry*

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Education for Ministry (EFM) is a program of theological education to help lay people understand and interpret their faith in what often seems to be a complex and confusing world. It is based on the belief that every baptized person is called to the ministry of the whole people of God. It holds a vision of “an active, theologically articulate laity” working in partnership with the clergy to bring about God’s kingdom on earth.

During the baptism service we hear the words, “Renew in these your servants the covenant you made with them at Baptism. Send them forth in the power of the Spirit to perform the service you set before them.” (BAS p628) EFM is one way of helping people respond to this call and understand their ministry in the ordinary events of life. The program includes Biblical studies, church history, theology, ethics, and contemporary theological issues. Students study at home, then meet in seminar groups once a week to reflect on their studies and to share their faith journeys.

As a mentor of the Christ Church EFM group I have a quiet joy in acknowledging the great strengths of the group which has now been a part of the cathedral life for 10 years: the openness to hearing each other’s stories; the sharing of struggles with Biblical texts and theological concepts; the supporting of one another in times of personal grief or celebration; the deepening of friendship in Christian community; the occasional bumping up against each others individual idiosyncrasies; the times of prayer; good laughs and delight in getting to know one another.

Here is what some of our members have said about our cathedral EFM group.

“We are a diverse group of people who come together in love, faith and support of each other”

“The group is a mature group of educated, compassionate people. They are an excellent group to be involved with.”

“The strengths and talents of our group include sensitivity; inclusiveness; empathy; constructive criticism; humour; supportiveness; spirituality; sincerity.”

“I most appreciate the lessons I have learned about myself. I have learned to be kinder and gentler with myself. I have learned it is okay to not have an answer and sometimes a question is a better response.”

## *HIV/AIDS Outreach Committee*

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Who are most likely to be affected by the HIV/AIDS pandemic? According to the Globe and Mail's André Picard, the incidence of HIV/AIDS has increased here in Canada to 1982 levels and the most affected by the disease now are the marginalized in our country; namely intravenous drug users, aboriginal peoples, Métis women and immigrants. He quotes Ron Rosenes of the Canadian Treatment Action Council, who says that Canada "has developing world conditions in pockets of our country".

Steffanie Strathdee, Associate Dean of Global Health Sciences at UCLA, San Diego, speaking at the International AIDS Conference in Vienna, supported Rosenes' statement that Canada is falling behind significantly in prevention programs. "The Canadian National AIDS Strategy has withered," she said. While it is true that the death rate has fallen, incidence is on the rise and the drivers are "inequalities of race, ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation and immigration status". One of the most troubling problems among these groups is that a large number of people are not aware they are infectious.

For those of us working for the Home-Based Caregivers who are engaged in AIDS work in their South African community of Soweto, this sounds very familiar. As here in Canada, in Sub-Saharan Africa the marginalized are the most affected by the disease. According to The Joint United Nations Programme on HIV/AIDS (UNAIDS) gender inequities, violence, lack of access to education, health and economic opportunities are making far more women than men vulnerable to HIV. AIDS is also a major cause of maternal mortality. Preventing new infections and AIDS-related deaths amongst young women in South Africa is crucial. As a result, one aspect of the caregivers' work now is conducting door-to-door campaigns educating some of the most marginalized about

HIV and its transmission, encouraging them to be tested and providing free condoms. When you buy one of our cookies on Sunday morning you are supporting their work.

Please stop by our table this Sunday and sign a letter to one of the Members of Parliament on the Commons Committee on Industry, Science and Technology, soon to be reviewing Canada's Access to Medicine Regime, asking them to make it easier for generic anti-retroviral drugs to be sent to developing countries. We have a list of the members of the committee, some of whom are not supportive of these changes. You can help by signing and mailing a letter to one of them. This is an initiative of the Grandmothers to Grandmothers Campaign.

# Curate's Notes

AUGUST 1ST, 2010

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When I was watching the opening ceremonies of the Vancouver Winter Olympics I was simply thunderstruck by the performance of K.D. Lang and her rendition of Leonard Cohen's song 'Hallelujah'. For me, it alone made the entire evening. I thought afterwards, among other things, how amazing it really is for an openly gay person to be given such a prominent role in such an important event. As we celebrate Pride Day this Sunday, I think it is important to remember that not so very long ago K.D. Lang would have had to be very much in the closet or surely destroy her career if she came out of it. I believe God has very much been with us on this walk to justice and freedom and the fact that K.D. Lang sang *Hallelujah* was a happy confluence of hitherto disparate realities that was not lost on this viewer.

If you have ever seen the movie "Milk" about early gay activist and politician Harvey Milk (and if you have not, what I am about to say should not ruin the movie for you in any way), you will likely remember the remarkable opening credits. The credits were shown with the background of real footage of gay bar raids by the police in the 1950's and 1960's. These short scenes showed the patrons of the bars getting questioned and arrested. I will never forget the looks on the faces of these men – they were angry, ashamed, scared and resigned to their fate. It was very difficult for me to watch. The vast majority of society was bullying and persecuting a small minority because they could, because it made them feel self-righteous and perhaps safer, and this was in part due to the teaching of the collective Christian church at the time.

We have come a long way and we need to celebrate that fact this day. But even in 2010 we still have a ways to go in order to claim that GLBT persons are equal in every respect in the law and in the church and in society at large. We still hear of gay high school students being given a hard time, we still have to overcome gay bashing right here in Vancouver, we read with horror laws which might be passed in Uganda that would make homosexuality punishable by death and life imprisonment for those who know-

ingly help homosexuals.

Just as the Christian church historically played a role in persecuting GLBT persons, many – including ours of course – are now a part of the solution. We recognize that diversity is not only a part of God's plan it is a vital component of life on earth, as we know it. We know that GLBT people were and are born GLBT people, and that is a part of God's plan for us. We have come to realize that in the end GLBT relationships are about love and should be celebrated as such, just as with heterosexual relationships. We are all different and we are all the same. It is simple and complex, and the more I know about God the more I think She likes it just this way.

This Pride day is indeed a day for celebration. But, I think when we have a moment or two by ourselves; we could and should remember the past. I think we should ask for forgiveness for the sins of the church in former times that led to unspeakable sorrow, hurt and harm over the centuries. I think we should pray for the continued reconciliation of the church and the GLBT community. I think we should pray for all elements of society in our community and around the world that are still struggling with this issue and for the GLBT persons most affected. Perhaps most of all we should thank God for the light He has shown us in our GLBT brothers and sisters. Thank God also for the love that unites us all in our diversity and sameness. Thank God that we can this day have this celebration – Hallelujah!

On an unrelated matter – next Sunday will be my last day at Christ Church Cathedral. I would very much like to save my thanks to all of you until then. However, I know many of you are off to vacation and such and I just wanted to thank you very briefly here for your many well wishes, for your incredible support, and for an amazing two years that I will always remember and hold close to my heart. May God bless you all as abundantly as I have been at this church.
