Share the Gifts

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant. The bread is received in the open palm. The wine may be taken from the common cup, **or if you wish to dip bread in the wine, extend one hand for a wafer.** Both wine and unfermented grape juice are served, grape juice is administered from the pottery chalice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request in the East alcove.



Prayer and Laying-on of Hands for Healing

We invite those wishing particular prayer for themselves or on behalf of someone else, or to share in a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings received, to come to the front of the line to receive the bread and wine. Immediately after receiving, go to the prayer station. Give your first name and in a low voice briefly state your prayer need. The prayer team will lay hands gently on your shoulders and after a short silence, they will pray quietly for you.

While the communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence — this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.

Every once in a while when I hear Allan Gregg on the CBC's At Issue Panel use the term 'chump change', meaning a small amount of change hardly worth doing anything for, I am reminded that the HIV/AIDS Africa Outreach Committee knows that chump change can add up to significant amounts of money when everyone chips in to the collection. One of the first things our committee did several years ago was to encourage people to collect all their chump change during Lent. That money gave us the courage to continue with other fund raising projects. We collect chump change at the cookie table every Sunday. This amounts to about \$200 a month. A little girl named Linnea twice gave us her birthday present money - the money her friends would have spent for birthday presents. Another child gave us a collection of pennies. This week, Satinder Powers gave us a large tin of change -over \$74.00 worth and that's not chump! Thank you, Satinder for saving all those coins for Bochabelo. This is what your \$74.00 will buy in Soweto, South Africa, where our health care cooperative project works to help relieve the suffering of those sick and dying from HIV/AIDS, encourages people to be tested for AIDS and TB as well as other sexually transmitted diseases, distributes condoms to prevent the spread of STDs and seeks to identify orphans needing care and schooling.

Archdeacon's Notes

NOVEMBER 7, 2010

Today we celebrate the feast of All Saints, and I want to share with you a passage from Elizabeth A. Johnson's book *Friends of God and Prophets* which perfectly sums up this feast for me:

In a particular way this is a day that celebrates the great host of "anonymous" whom the world counts as nobodies and whom the church, too, has lost track of but who are held in the embrace of God who loses not one. Canonized saints have their day on the calendar, but this is the day for everyone. "When we celebrate All Saints," writes Rahner, "we have in mind chiefly those saints who are anonymous, the unknown saints who ... lived quietly in the land, the poor and the little ones who were great only in God's eyes, those who go unacclaimed in any of the rolls of honour belonging to the Church or to world history." To his list of qualities I would add those nameless saints who raised a little hell in defense of the vulnerable and the growth of justice. All are celebrated in this remembrance of the generations of God-seekers.

We can all probably name some of the 'unacclaimed' saints who have evaded the notice of officialdom. I would include in that list my grandfather who patiently and faithfully worked as a priest and as a father. Not a perfect man – he used to hide in the cellar during thunderstorms because he had an irrational fear of lightning – but one who lived a life of love and service. He, like most saints, would have rejected the title, except as it refers to all God's children – to all of us who attempt to live a life of love and service and decency despite the fact that we know we often fail.

The Diocese doesn't have the power to make saints, but it is doing its bit to try and recognize some of the 'unacclaimed' within our own church whose service has been both long and faithful. Each parish within the Diocese is allowed to nominate one person each year to receive the Order of the Diocese of New Westminster, and, in addition, the Bishop can nominate ten people who have con-

tributed to the life of the diocese as a whole.

This year three of our cathedral congregation are receiving this honour. Our own nominee is Ian Birtwell who served as Rector's Warden for two years and then helped guide the parish through the choppy seas of the restoration process as Associate Warden. The Bishop has also nominated two of our congregation: Neale Adams and Penny Charlesworth. Neale gave sterling service to the diocese as its communications director, and we are delighted to have his skills to help with the editing of *Contact* now that his diocesan role is completed. Penny served on MCDC, Diocesan Council and the Cathedral Chapter at the same time as doing numerous volunteer jobs within our cathedral community from prayer link to office reception to organizing receptions. All three, along with about 45 other nominees from churches across the diocese, will receive the Order at the service here this afternoon.

So today let's celebrate all the saints, acclaimed and unacclaimed, who have allowed us to see something of the love of God shining through their lives. And let's pray that we also may become icons of God's love for others. Maybe we can find the courage to pray in the words of Janet Morley: *Christ, whose insistent call disturbs our settled lives: give us discernment to hear your word, grace to relinquish our tasks, and courage to follow empty-handed wherever you may lead; that the voice of your love may reach to the ends of the earth.*
