Share the Gifts

If you know the brokenness of life, its fractures within and its division without, then you have participated in the broken body of Christ and you are invited to share in the breaking of bread. If you desire to know the love of God that overcomes indifference and despair, if you desire the reconciliation that overcomes estrangement and alienation then you are invited to share the cup of the new covenant. The bread is received in the open palm. It is usual Anglican practice to drink the wine from the common cup. **If you wish to dip bread in the wine, extend one hand for a wafer.** Both wine and unfermented grape juice are served, grape juice is administered from the pottery chalice. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request in the East alcove.



Prayer and Laying-on of Hands for Healing

We invite those wishing particular prayer for themselves or on behalf of someone else, or to share in a prayer of thanksgiving for blessings received, to come to the front of the line to receive the bread and wine. Immediately after receiving, go to the prayer station. Give your first name and in a low voice briefly state your prayer need. The prayer team will lay hands gently on your shoulders and after a short silence, they will pray quietly for you.

While the communion is being administered, we respectfully ask that you keep the silence — this is a time for quiet prayer and meditation.

Grandmothers to Grandmothers Campaign is composed of some 10,000 women from more than 240 groups from coast to coast who speak on behalf of a large network of hundreds of thousands of other like-minded Canadian voters, whom we call "grandothers." They have worked tirelessly to persuade the Canadian government to enact changes to the Canadian Access to Medicine Regimen (CAMR), making it easier to send anti-retroviral medicines to developing countries. These changes were recently rejected by the House of Commons Committee on Industry, Science and Technology, a group heavily influenced by the Canadian pharmaceutical industry. While these changes were defeated in committee, the Grandmothers were not. Come and hear Ann speak on the work of the Advocacy Committee and give us 'grandothers' here at Christ Church some pointers on how we can still help right now to support a Private Member's Bill.

We'll also have an opportunity to sign a Christmas greeting to the caregivers at the Soweto Home-Based Caregivers Cooperative.

Legacy Stewardship

WHERE THERE'S A WILL...

...yes, there's a way. And we all have wills, don't we? Of course we do.

By chance, earlier this fall I needed to revise my will, for reasons totally unconnected with the Parish and Christ Church Cathedral. However, this exercise provided a wonderful opportunity to have a fresh look at how much I was leaving to CCC and to other charities, whether Church-related or not, and in what form.

As a result of this review, I made the immediate decision to substantially increase the amount that the Parish will receive when I "have shuffled off this mortal coil". The question then was how best to achieve this and how to keep it as simple as possible, so that the Parish would not be tied down with inflexible restrictions, which I believe has happened occasionally in the past. A short while back, the Parish set up the Cathedral Heritage Property Fund, to essentially replace the two pre-existing property funds, with the commitment to bring the total up to \$1.4 million over time. Directly or indirectly we are all part of that commitment, so it made sense for most of my bequest to be channeled to that fund.

However, one of the problems with dying (and not just for me!) is that CCC loses the annual contribution to the Parish Fund. Therefore I have arranged that, for each of the two years following the year of my death, the Parish will receive the same contribution as it is receiving now, to be used wherever the Dean determines are the areas of greatest need. In fact, this will result in the Parish receiving and retaining more than it currently does, because it will not have to forward part of the funds to PWRDF or the Restoration and Renewal Fund. For PWRDF, I have made a separate bequest

in my will. I have also been supporting GEM on an annual basis and would hope that at least part of these "posthumous" contributions will be directed to those ministries, but that would be at the discretion of the Dean.

There is a sort of vicarious pleasure one can get from giving money away to good causes. It becomes almost self-indulgent. It is not quite as much fun as doing it while one is still alive, but there will no doubt be plenty of opportunity to do that soon, just to make sure we have a roof over our heads during liturgy!

The Santa Claus Parade

SUNDAY, DEC. 5TH, 2010

The seventh annual Rogers Santa Claus Parade will take place Sunday, December 5th at 1pm.

This is the fifth consecutive year the parade has started at 1pm. The time was changed to 1pm from 11am in 2006 largely due to lobbying of City Council by the clergy, staff and parish leadership of Christ Church Cathedral and thanks to the supportive cooperation of City of Vancouver staff responsible for street closings and special events. The parade route begins at Georgia and Broughton, travels to Howe, turns right on Howe and finishes at Davie Street.

The parade will run approximately 90 minutes and Vancouver Police will close streets to all traffic with rolling closures as the parade makes its way east on Georgia.

WE'RE OPEN AS USUAL! Here's how to get in and how to get out! **Getting In:** On the bottom of the page you will find a map. This map has the best routes in and out to the Park Place Parkade. Coming to Church, it's best to approach the Cathedral heading west on Georgia, then turning down Hornby street (don't worry, Georgia will not be closed until after the service starts!), or if you're coming from the west come down Pender and turn up Howe. We advise parishioners to **NOT** approach the Cathedral via Robson or other parallel roads, because there will be barriers that will be difficult or impossible to cross. If you are stopped by the police on your way to parking, please just flash your parking pass. The police have been advised of the importance of allowing parishioners to access Park Place Parkade.

Getting Out: We suggest that at the completion of the 10:30 service the congregation exit via the elevator and/or the rear staircase in the new addition out and into the lane or come downstairs and exit through the lower level Burrard street (as many of you do anyway) and leave the front plaza clear. As you leave the Park Place Parkade, there will be police positioned at the corner of Hornby and Dunsmuir. They have been briefed on the importance of allowing those attending the Cathedral access to and from the Park Place Parkade. Please show your Cathedral Parking Pass and they will let you through. The downtown streets closed for the parade will re-open by 3:45pm.

Walking? There may be fencing around certain areas of Christ Church Cathedral, but they will not block the stairs and ramps.

Coffee Hour: To make this transition easier, the **Coffee Hour will only happen at 9am.** Bochabelo cookies will be available.

Last year the crowds were large with estimates of over 300,000. People started arriving fairly early to stake out their territory for the parade but the impact on the Cathedral was negligible. So remember; don't be afraid of the Santa Claus parade and we will see everybody here for worship as usual, December 5, 2010.

Notes from the Deacon & Business Chaplain

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT 2010

Good morning and Happy New Year! If this is your first visit to Christ Church Cathedral, you are in for a treat! Welcome and we hope you enjoy the music, the community, the preaching, and our common humanity. We begin the season of Advent today, and already, or so it seems to me, we can feel the excitement of new life, new possibilities, even beneath the shortened days, the snow of the past week, and the rain, the cold, hard rain. (I'm reminded, not surprisingly of the Guns and Roses song, November Rain!)

Our Gospel reading this morning tells us that some of us will be "left behind." Now, many will know this language triggers me emotionally. I can get very angry when some of our Christian brothers and sisters suggest that passages like this are to be taken literally. Please be assured that there will be no apocalyptic moment when suddenly I am sitting on a plane with no pilot because she is a true believer and has been bodily taken to heaven while I, along with most of the rest of the planet are left to face some great religious war!

Rather, a way of reflecting on this passage, especially as we begin Advent, is that all of us are called to "wake up"! There is a different way of being, a different way of living. And all of us know this already. The Spirit of God, the Spirit of Life is in each of us, and She is telling us, and has told us already, that life is to be lived abundantly, justly, with love and mercy, and loving our neighbours as ourselves. Whether we are at work in the fields or at the office, whether we are grinding at the mill, or driving a truck, we know the right thing to do, and the right way to be. God knows that in the fields, in the offices, in the mills or on the highway, wherever we are out and about in our daily lives, we are faced with choices between ego, self driven lives, and abundant, full and authentic lives. Most of the time however, we choose the ego, self driven life, and that means once again, we are 'left behind'

God's will for each and every one of us.

This Advent we are called once more to a new year of life and possibilities. We are called to a way of living that works towards a time when no one is left behind. A time when each and every person on the planet has access to a full and just life. In Matthew's thinking, a time when God could shown up unannounced, and find justice, peace and harmony on the planet. A time when we don't have to give to the food bank, we don't have to think of those less fortunate than ourselves during this "holiday season", because there are no more hungry children, there are no more fortunate and less fortunate people. There are simply loving and caring humans. A time when there is peace on earth and good will for all people.

This new year, may we each Wake Up!
